throwing

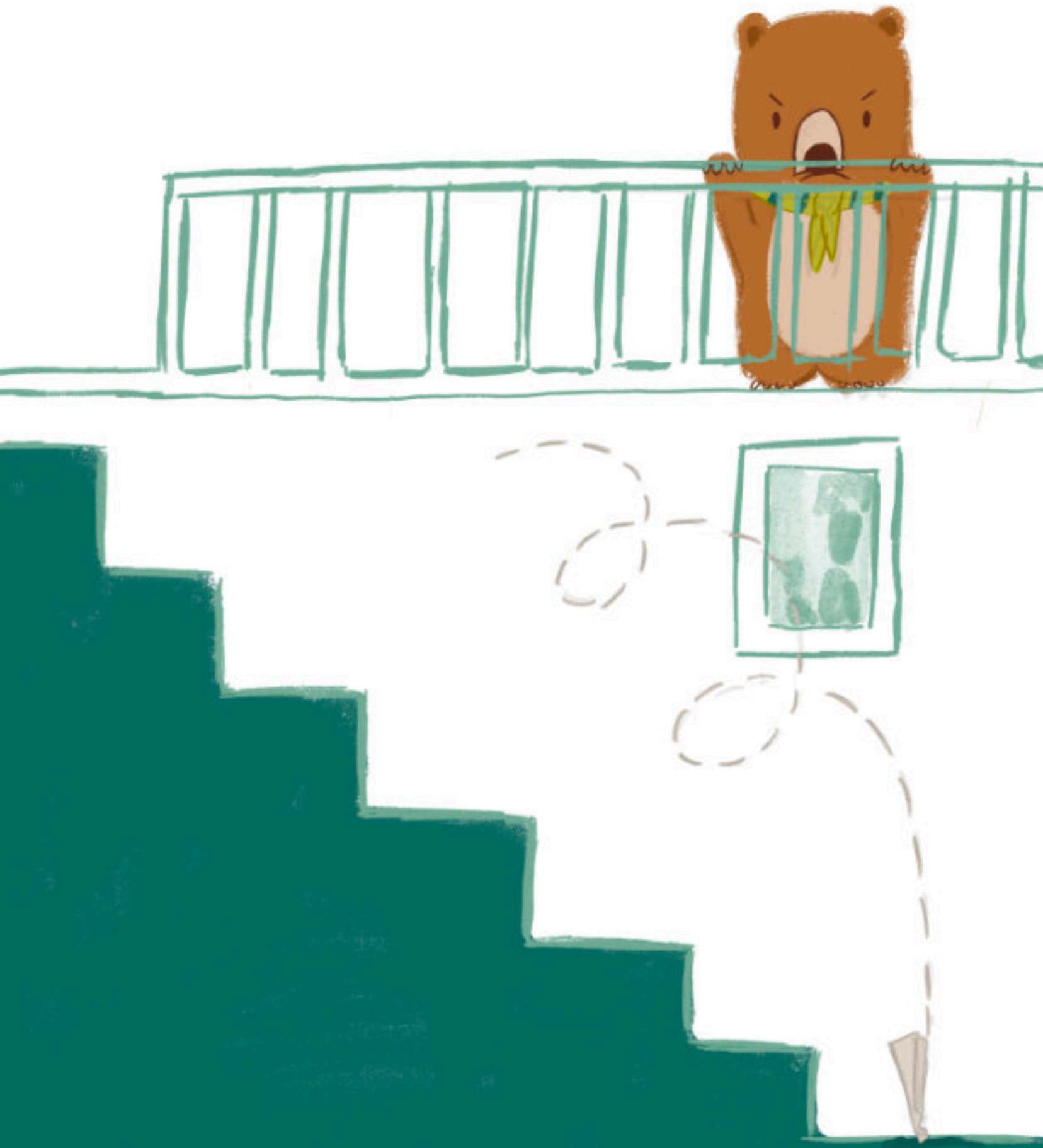
his plane

which was strange...

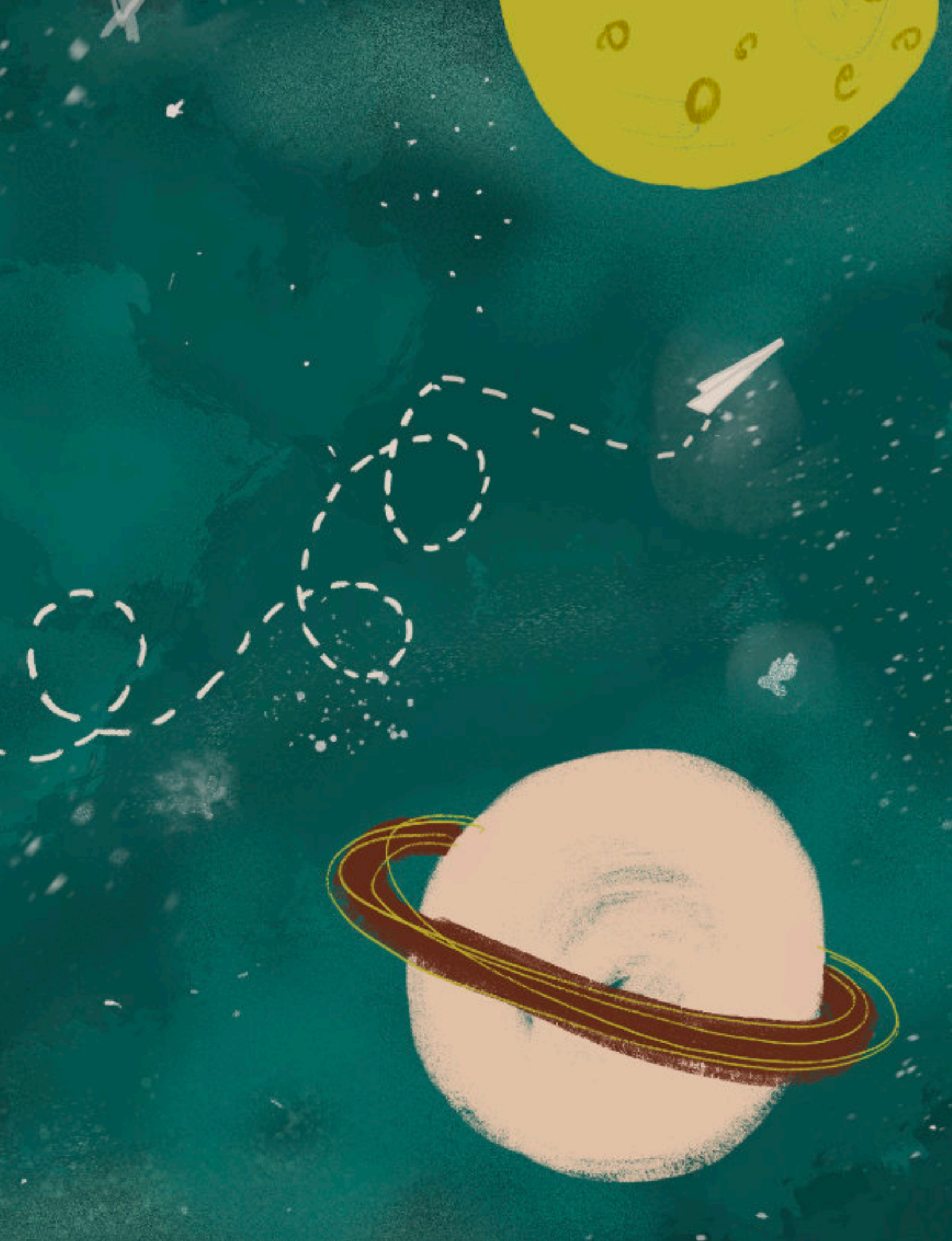


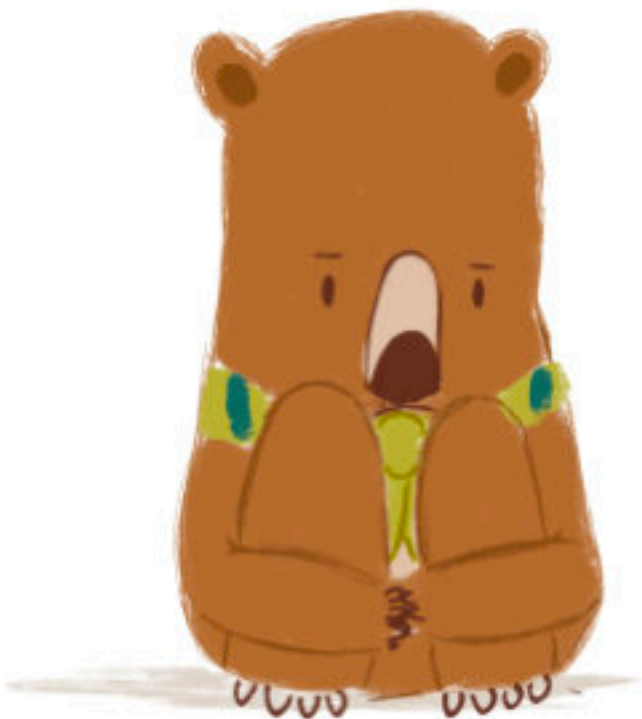
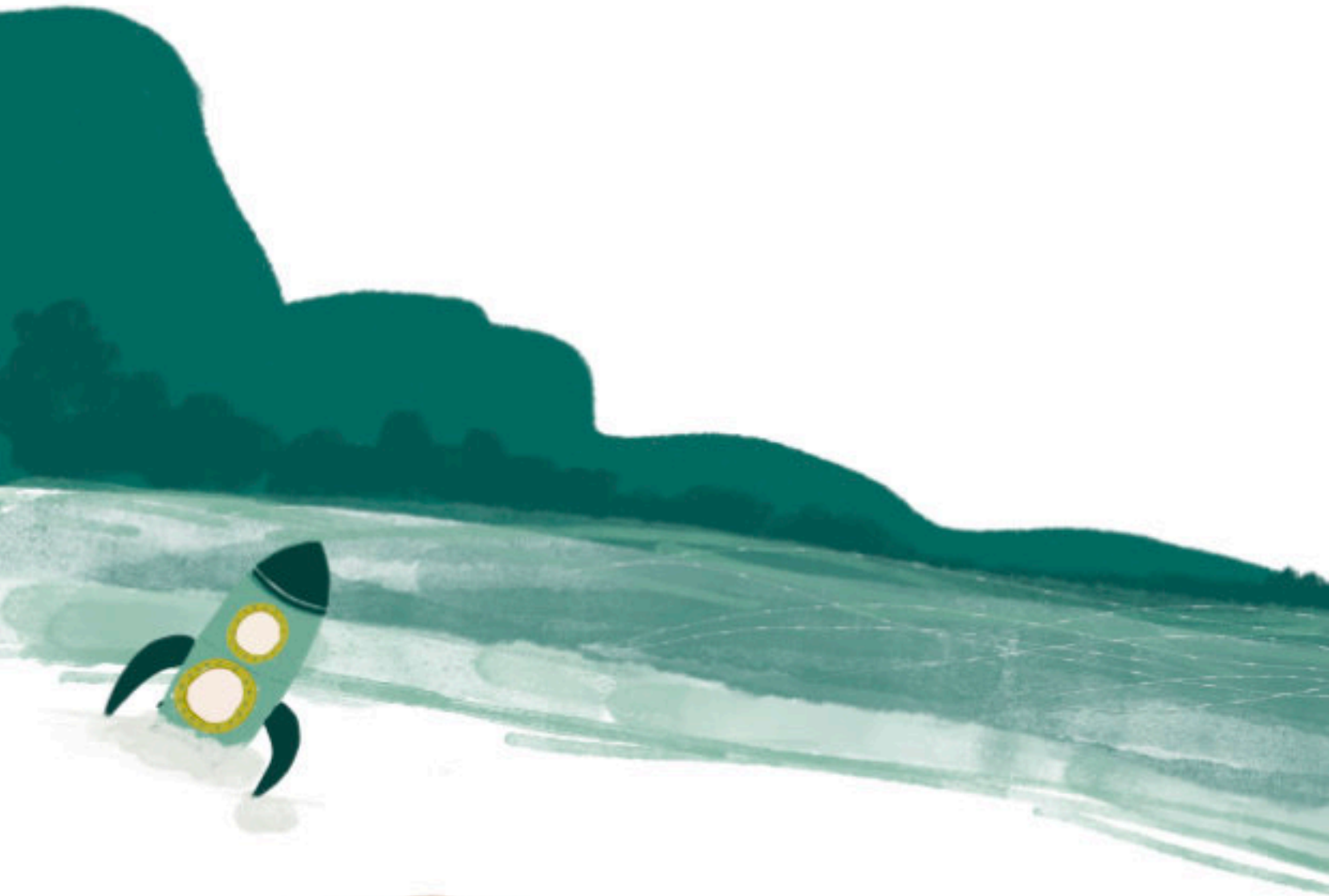
and even got his plane

was lost...

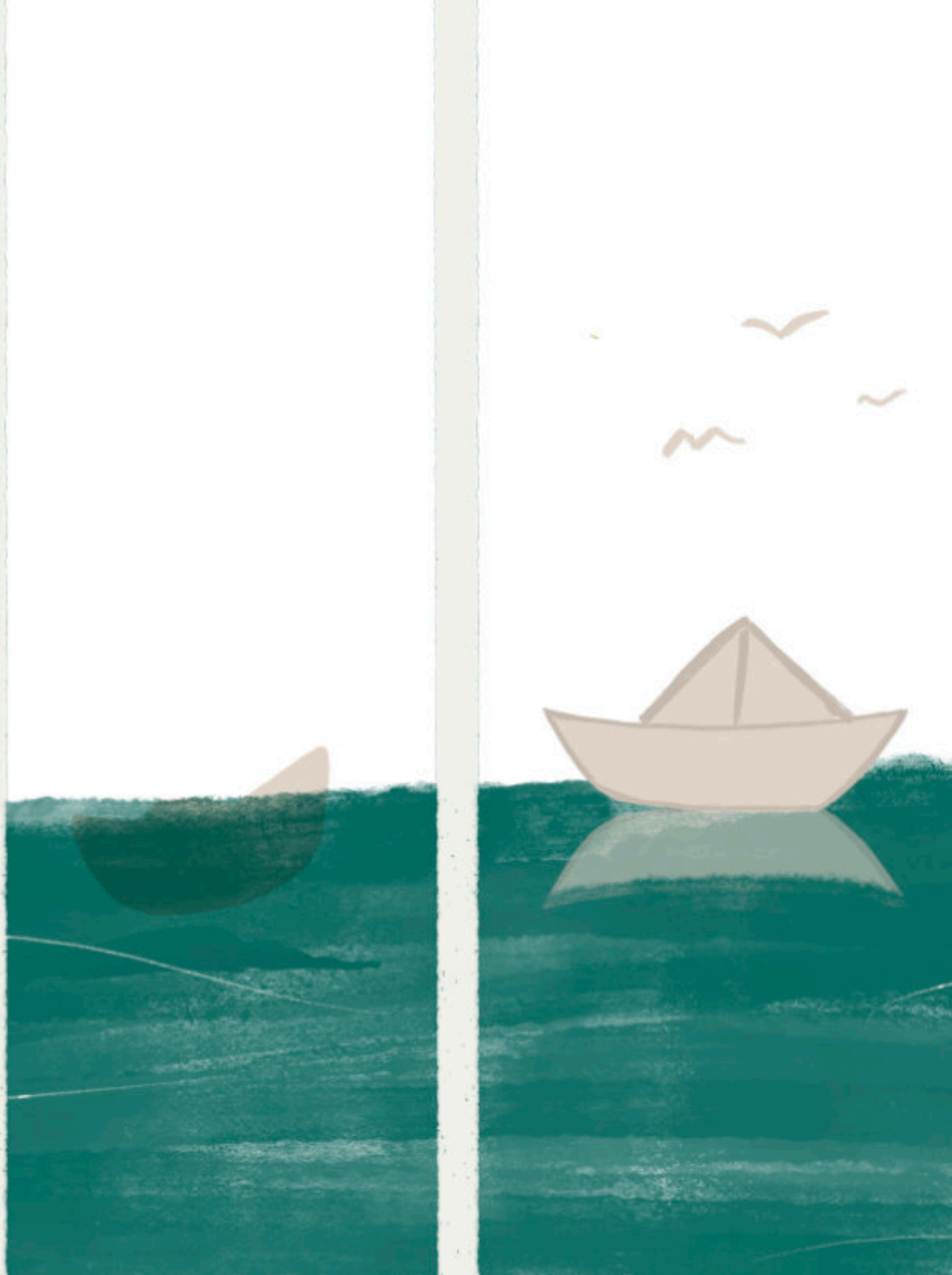

And off he sailed.

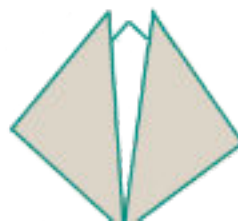
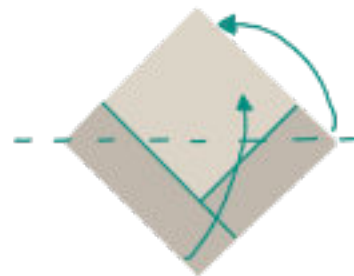
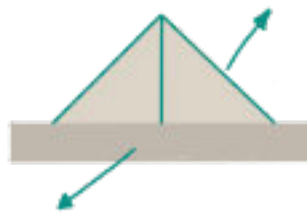
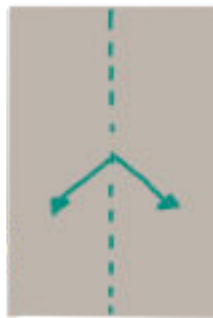




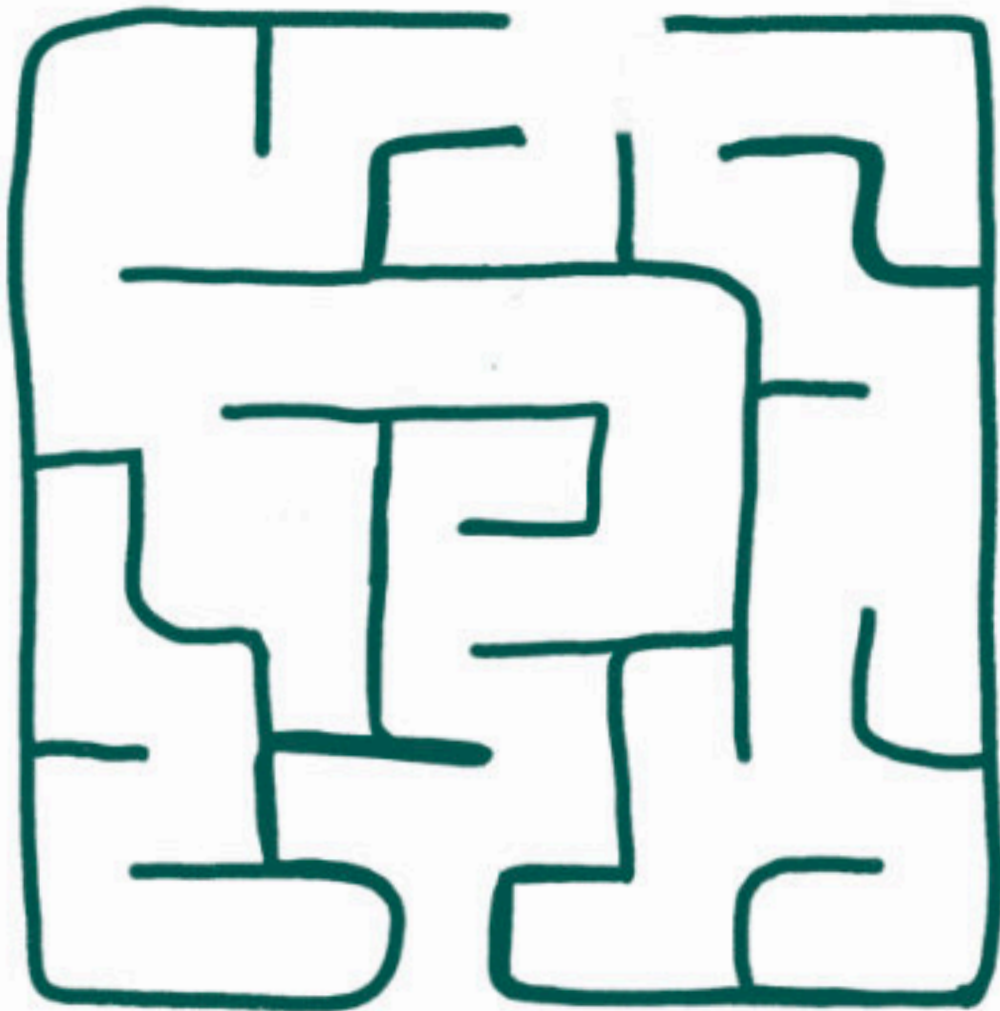
